- **Public Meeting** Discussion of the ultimate use of the land at the intersection of Cross Street and Route 3, adjacent to the Town Hall.
  - o Community Center/Rec Center that possibly doubles as a Senior Center.
  - Community Fields There are approx. 300 students in Thornton and the lack of sports facilities may be limiting opportunities for students to participate in sports.
  - Playground/park
  - Dog Park
  - Tennis/Pickleball courts
  - Pavilion for gatherings with picnic tables
  - Interior space for cyclists and snowmobilers (warming, drinks, snacks)
  - Upgrade Fire Station can we rehab the building to a community center with bathrooms?
  - o B. Hatcher recommended that the committee create Ph 1-3 scenarios
  - The committee should investigate grant writing opportunities to fund some of these initiatives
  - o Action: J.Peznola to sketch out scenarios that could be implemented in phases.

## Update Landfill Solar

- Eversource owns the power lines.
- o Both companies (Encore & Revision) are interested in building solar panels if they can be built under the power lines.

- o If solar can't be built, due to land size, then only Revision is interested in a solar project.
- Encore came up with an alternate proposal to lease the land and use it for energy storage (batteries).
- B. Hatcher will work with Eversource to determine the easement and size of land available for solar project.

## Update Full-Time Home-Owners Tax Savings

- B. Hatcher presented several property tax relief scenarios using Town Administrator,
  Master Planning Committee and Assessment Department data.
- These scenarios were for discussion purposes only and generated several questions from the committee in which J. Monti volunteered to research three of the questions (5-7)
- Review Title VI Section 91-A regarding Committee communication outside of meetings.
  - EDC is not a decision-making authority (evaluates economic alternatives and presents to the Board of Selectmen) therefore can have discussions outside of meetings.
